Dia Art Foundation and **Electronic Arts Intermix (EAI)** are pleased to present a special screening of artist Joan Jonas's *Volcano Saga* (1989). Based on the thirteenth-century Icelandic *Laxdeala Saga*, this narrative reverie is a televisual retelling of a medieval myth about a young woman (played by Tilda Swinton) whose dreams foretell the future.

Originally performed live, *Volcano Saga* featured artist Joan Jonas on stage narrating an Icelandic folktale about a woman named Gudrun, whose adventures revolved around four mysterious dreams that required the services of a soothsayer. Projections of Iceland's landscape created a visual backdrop.

Jonas translated this performance into video. Shot in the dramatic natural landscapes of Iceland and New York, this 28-minute video features Tilda Swinton as Gudrun. Employing layered digital effects, Jonas creates a ritualistic dreamscape of the young woman's imagination and desires.

The screening will be followed by a Q&A with the artist moderated by Dia associate curator Kelly Kivland.

Joan Jonas was born in New York in 1936. After receiving an MFA from Columbia University, Jonas went on to become a preeminent figure in the video and performance art movements of the 1960s and 1970s. Her acclaimed multimedia work encompasses performance, installation, video, sound, text, and drawing.

Jonas has performed at venues worldwide, including The Kitchen, New York (1974, 1977, 2004), Documenta, Kassel (1972, 1977, 1982, 1987, 2002, 2012), and The Museum of Modern Art, New York (1987). Her site-specific video installation, titled *The Shape, the Scent, the Feel of Things*, was presented at Dia:Beacon in 2005 and 2006. She represented the United States at the 56th Venice Biennale (2015), and a recent retrospective of her work was presented at Malmö Konsthall in Sweden (2015–16). An exhibition of her work is currently on view at the NTU Centre for Contemporary Art Singapore (NTU CCA Singapore). Jonas is professor emerita at Massachusetts Institute of Technology, Boston. She lives and works in New York
